NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING: The Park County Planning and Zoning Commission will hold a public hearing at 3PM, Wednesday, August 25th, 2010 in the Community Room of the City\County Complex at 414 East Callender, Livingston, MT. The reason for the public hearing is to consider a variance request submitted by Jim Martinson. The owner is proposing the construction of 1,288 sq. ft. log garage and is requesting a variance from stream setbacks.
