Project Status Meeting McLaren Tailings Reclamation Project, Montana Department of Environmental Quality When: 6:30 – 7:30 p.m., Tuesday, June 8, 2010 Where: Fire Hall, 102 West Main Street, Cooke City, MT

The Montana Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) will conduct a project status meeting to present information about the McLaren Tailings Reclamation Project near Cooke City in Park County. The meeting is scheduled for 6:30 p.m., Tuesday, June 8, 2010, at the Fire Hall in Cooke City. The public is encouraged to attend and will have an opportunity to ask questions. The DEQ Abandoned Mine Section will remove approximately 240,000 cubic yards, or one-half million tons, of contaminated mine wastes from the former McLaren Mill Site over the next six years. Topics to be discussed at the meeting include project objectives, the schedule of work planned for this summer and fall, and site reclamation plans for subsequent years. Mary Margaret Curl tells us that the Mather brothers were the only two folks that played instruments. If they offered their services there was a town dance at the old Wells Saloon.

"We danced the quadrilles all evening, everyone dancing, even the old men. At these dances, I had my very best times".

"Oh, what parties we had" Ingaborg Reeb tells us. "Her family had the most children, so the miners would come to the house and take a child under each arm with small legs dangling out behind and away they would go to the chosen saloon. Pool tables were pushed to the corners for the children to sleep on, while the grown-ups danced. There was plenty of coffee and food. We had such good times and it didn't cost a penny."
