COMMUNITY BUILDING UPDATE: Memorial Day weekend was when we had hoped to be open to the public, this means; all requirements to open the doors to the public are completed for our certificate of occupancy! Allowing use of the public restrooms, visitor center, chamber, conference room by **MEMORIAL DAY!** BUT, with this last month of weather being the worst (snow & frost, etc.) we do not know when we can open the doors to the **PUBLIC!** We were fortunate enough to have a Contractor work on the building through the winter but the excavation, sidewalks need cooperation from the weatherman!! Pray for sunshine! We will let you know as soon as possible when the public use can begin! The Visitor Center/Chamber services will remain in the current place until the public can use the building.

A reminder of the years of planning that were implemented to make this **FIRST BUILDING** a reality! Since it has been several years for the planning of the 2 Building Phases please remember this was the long term plan: The Community building (PHASE 1) consisted of: PUBLIC RESTROOMS, VISITOR CENTER, MUSEUM, CONFERENCE ROOM, 2 OFFICE SPACES. Remember this building cost was cut in **HALF** from the original design to fit the community budget. A huge thanks to everyone who has made this happen! The **SECOND BUILDING** will replace the Fire Hall, S&R building. The plans for this building (PHASE 2) consists of: SEARCH & RESCUE, FIRE DEPT., EMS BAY & THEIR OFFICES, LARGE RECEPTION TYPE HALL (SAME USEAGE AS CURRENTLY PROVIDED IN THE FIRE HALL, LARGE GROUPS, PARTIES, COOKING, ETC.). New suggestions in regards to the components of Phase 2 have been casual conversation in the community. Also we are going to be working to bring parties from Wyoming, YNP, FS, and our own County together to hold at least one public meeting here in Cooke City. There have been discussions on this topic already, which have not included our community, whom it affects the most. These other parties will not be looking at our **3 major issues that the Chamber is concerned with**, these issues have to be resolved **BEFORE** they plow; 1) Parking 2) Trail Access 3) Plowing.

Road Opening Schedule: April 16, 2010—Weather permitting, west-side roads open to motor vehicles. Mammoth to Norris Junction to Madison Junction to Old Faithful; Madison Junction to West Entrance. In addition, Norris Junction to Canyon opens to wheeled vehicles. **May 7, 2010**—Weather permitting, Canyon to Lake, Lake to East Entrance opens to wheeled vehicles. **May 14, 2010**—Tower to Tower Fall opens to wheeled vehicles. Lake to West Thumb, West Thumb to Old Faithful, and South to Old Faithful opens to wheeled vehicles. Cooke City via Colter Pass to the Chief Joseph Scenic Highway intersection to the Long Lake gate shall open as soon thereafter as possible. **May 28, 2010**—Long Lake Gate over the Beartooth, and Tower Falls to Canyon will be open.
