Delorale “Doe” Johnston

Delorale Ann Johnston, known to friends as Doe, passed at her Davis home on October 13, 2009 after four years of fighting ovarian cancer. She was born June 26, 1934 in Turlock, California to Charles and Genevieve Proctor. She lived in the country outside Turlock until 1941 when her family moved to Piedmont, California where Doe graduated from High School in 1952 and from the University of California at Berkeley in 1956 with a degree in Social Welfare. She worked as a Recreation Supervisor for the Palo Alto Recreation Department after graduation before marrying Bob Johnston in 1957. Bob and Doe met at the Crusader Youth Group at the First Methodist Church in Oakland where Doe's parents were the counselors. Doe was a substitute teacher before accepting a regular position in San Lorenzo while Bob completed his Masters program at Cal. They moved to Vallejo in 1960 where Doe taught at Pennycook School until their children arrived. She enjoyed being a stay- at- home mom, caring for their new home and participating in League of Women Voters. Every summer they packed up to spend the weeks in Yellowstone National Park at the Lamar Buffalo Ranch where Bob was a seasonal ranger. This was a delightful, special time in the beautiful outdoors with abundant opportunities for recreation to share with family and friends.

In 1970 they moved to Davis, where Bob accepted a position as Vice Principal at Emerson Jr. High School. Doe did some home teaching while the children were in school, but eventually returned to school at Sacramento State to earn her Masters Degree in Special Education in 1979. She accepted a position in the Woodland Public Schools where she was employed until her retirement in 1994. She enjoyed helping special students learn. A highlight of her teaching career was when she and a co-worker organized a driving trip to study in Yellowstone Park just before her retirement.

In 1971, Bob and Doe built a cabin in Cooke City, Montana near Yellowstone Park where they spent part of the summer with their family and friends. They have especially enjoyed having their children, Clay and Jill, and the grandchildren come to enjoy this special country with them. Doe traveled with friends to England, Ireland and Scotland and, following retirement, with Bob through Chile, Argentina, Europe and Australia, but it was Yellowstone that always beckoned.

She loved to watch the daffodils bloom in early spring at her Davis home and again in early summer in Montana. She was also an avid rhubarb enthusiast, growing and sharing the plants with Montana neighbors; she and her friends published a rhubarb cookbook for the benefit of the Mount Republic Chapel of Peace in Cooke City. She enjoyed sewing and craft projects that she could share with others.

After being diagnosed with ovarian cancer in 2005, Doe became convinced women needed to become informed about this disease. She joined NOCC, National Ovarian Cancer Coalition, to learn more, spread the word about this silent killer, and seek support. Though she has lost her battle, it may not be in vain if more women will learn the facts about this disease. Doe leaves her husband, Bob; children Clay (Carol) Johnston and Jill Murphy; grandchildren Jenna and Jason Tullis, and Robby and Mark Murphy; and her sister Linda Crum-Helvig and nephew Brian Crum.

Doe enjoyed being part of a very special loving community in Cooke City, Montana and will be buried in the cemetery there. She leaves many friends in Cooke City and in Davis who gave loving support in her battle against ovarian cancer.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER Cooke City Interim Requirements

Our water system is in violation of a drinking water standard. Even though this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct the situation.

On May 1, 2002, the Montana Department of Environmental Quality classified our water system as being under the direct influence of surface water and ordered us to filter the water in addition to disinfecting.

What should I do?

- You do not need to boil your water. A home filter will not necessarily solve the problem, because not all home filters protect against parasites. Call NSF International at 1(800) NSF-8010 or the Water Quality Association at 1(800) 749-0234 for information on appropriate filters.
- People with severely compromised immune systems, people with an infant, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791. If you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

What does this mean? This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. We do not know of any cases of contamination. However, until improvements are made, there is an increased chance that disease-causing organisms could contaminate the water supply. *Inadequately treated water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites which can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches.*

What is being done? Our Water System will be monitoring turbidity (cloudiness) of the water twice daily, and submitting one water sample on Monday and one on Wednesday to check for the presence of fecal coliform (e-coli). All findings will be reported to the State DEQ on a weekly basis. The District will also post the results of the weekly water samples in the Cooke City Weekly Newsletter published each Friday.

Until this is completed we will post a notice similar to this every three months. For more information, please contact Patti Smith, PO Box 798 Livingston, MT 59047 or 406-539-7149.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
