

Big Fish Contest Rules

There are two divisions. Men and Woman. Children 12 years and older are considered in the adult division.

The contest is by length, not weight. Fish must be measured dressed at the official measure station at the Cooke City Chamber.

All fishing regulations must be abided by.

There is no entry fee. There are a limited number of entry applications. These will be issued on a first come basis. Applications will be accepted between July 1st. starting at 12:00p.m. and August 2nd. ending at 12:00 noon. You may enter the contest at the Cooke City Chamber or www.cookecitychamber.org

The contest begins at Sunrise on July 25 th. & ends on 4:00 August 2nd. Fish must be measured by 5:00 Saturday August 2nd.

No person is eligible for more than one prize.

Trophies and prizes will be awarded at the Saturday Cooke City Celebration You must be present to win.

If there is a tie in fish length, the first entry wins.

Lakes that Fish may be caught.

Fox Lake: May fish for brook trout and rainbow trout, but not for self-sustaining arctic grayling.

Kersey Lake: May fish for brook and lake trout, but not for self-sustaining Yellowstone cutthroat trout.

Lake Abundance: May fish for these stocked Yellowstone cutthroat trout.

Long Lake: May fish for brook trout, but not the self-sustaining Yellowstone cutthroats.

Lower Aero Lake: May fish for both brook trout and stocked Yellowstone cutthroats.

Ovis Lake: May fish for both brook trout and stocked Yellowstone cutthroats.

Rock Island Lake: May fish for both brook trout and stocked Yellowstone cutthroats.

Round Lake: May fish for brook trout, but not the self-sustaining Yellowstone cutthroat.

Upper Aero Lake: May fish for stocked Yellowstone cutthroat trout.
